REMARK

The SPDC or military regime said that it has freed 5,311 prisoners on top of the 3,937 announced on 18 November, according to a state radio broadcast. According to the military junta's media, it has released 9,248 prison inmates promised freedom under mass release program and they have been let out of jail, said a prison department source on 25 November. Out of those 9248 prisoners, only 40 are political prisoners.

REMARK: A prison-department official told the media all 5,070 detainees in the latest batch, mainly believed to be petty criminals, freed from 41 jails across the country by last Sunday (12 Dec. 2004), but no official announcement was made verification of how many political prisoners were freed. According to independent media, only 21 were political prisoners out of 5070 detainees released as third batch on 12 December, 2004.

The junta said the prisoners were freed due to "National Intelligence Bureau (NIB) irregularities," referring to military intelligence unit accused by the regime of abusing its powers in arresting thousands of citizens. The NIB was disbanded on 22 October in a purge that saw the sacking of its former head premier General Khin Nyunt who is under house arrest on corruption allegations.

In conclusion, the junta announced that it has released three batches of prisoners, totally 14,318. **But, out of 14,318 prisoners, only 61 were political prisoners.** Please find the details of the released political prisoners in the above tables. ///
